Culinary Delights

Day 1

11:00 a.m. Arrive in Greenwood and have Lunch

1:00 p.m. Bus tour to get acquainted with the downtown area

Your tour guide will point out places of interest such as the County Courthouse, Confederate Memorial, Front Street, Wesley United Methodist Church (circa 1870), and the Viking Range Corporation Headquarters.

2:00 p.m. Tour the Viking Range Plant

In 1987, the Viking Range Corporation introduced professional cooking to the home, and gourmets the world over rejoiced. So they added a range top, then a dishwasher, a refrigerator and even an outdoor range. And along the way, they created their own culture of creativity and innovation. Now they're applying Viking perfection to new categories like cookware, cutlery, and small appliances.

3:00 p.m. Downtown walking tour and shopping

Many of the city's downtown buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Several of the buildings have also received state and national historic preservation awards for their meticulous renovations.

6:00 p.m. Viking Cooking School – Demonstration Cooking Class

Students at the Viking Cooking School enjoy demonstration or hands-on lessons about everything from pizza to sushi from expert instructors and notable chefs in a complete Viking kitchen.

Day 2

9:00 a.m. Tour Cottonlandia Museum

While it chronicles the history of Leflore County and the Mississippi Delta with an emphasis on cotton agriculture, Greenwood's Cottonlandia Museum also houses an eclectic collection of items that weave a fascinating history of the area's past. The museum focuses on the five "A's": art, archaeology, agriculture, antiques and animals.
